

One-year schedule for transfer or second bachelor's students

This represents a possible schedule for a junior transfer pre-journalism student seeking a degree with an emphasis in Public Relations. Some courses listed here fulfill more than one requirement, as indicated. When choosing courses, watch for prerequisites. This schedule suggests heavy concentration in the lower-division core courses in journalism during the first three terms of study, which would allow the student to apply for full major status after the end of the third term.
